

Dear “Clothing” Project Member,

First, please put on your calendar the judging date: Monday, July 29th beginning at 9 am at the City Auditorium in LaCrosse. Last year, the judging was complete by about noon. The Public Fashion Revue will be Monday evening beginning at 7:00 p.m. Those in the fashion revue will be asked to be there at 6:45 pm to be ready and line up.

Changes were made at the State level in the clothing projects. Please ask questions if you need more clarification.

1. **Sewing and Textile Design** Dept. 18 in the fairbook (previously named Clothing & Textiles) are projects constructed with a sewing machine/serger or some may be sewn by hand. These do not have to be items that you wear. You can construct a pillowcase, a bag, a tool belt or other items made with fabric.
Items that you would wear must be judged in Fashion Revue – Dept 19.
Quilts (two pieces of fabric with possibly a batting with stitches to hold them together) **MUST** be exhibited in Fiber Arts.
2. **Shopping in Style** Dept. 20 (previously named Buymanship) will now have the young women and young men all in one class. **Shopping in Style Educational Display** is a new class. Please read more about these classes in the fairbook.

You will also need to enter ALL Clothing and Fashion Revue exhibits into the Rush County Fair on-line FairEntry.com system by 5:00 pm July 15th. Go to fairentry.com and sign in using your 4-H Online user name and password. A copy of the help guide for this process is included in your packet. A 4-H entry tag will be printed from these entries and will be ready for use at the judging event.

Each item will also need separate judges’ times to speak with the judge. A schedule will be sent out and posted by July 22nd. For Sewing and Textile Design, the project that is wearable will be judged at the table (the judge will look at construction, stitching, etc.) AND then you will put the outfit on and be judged on the fit, style and your appearance.

The Fashion Revue EVALUATION SCORECARD/COST PER WEAR is to be completed and handed to the judge when you model your outfit. Intermediates (10-13) and Seniors (14 and older) will also need to complete the Cost Per Wear form. Juniors (age 7-9) will complete the junior cost per wear that lists the items and accessories in the outfit and their cost. Form-fillable cost per wear is online.

SCRIPT CARD. Please complete the script card as you wish to have it read as you model. A form that is fillable can be found at www.walnutcreek.ksu.edu under 4-H and County Fair. If you need help writing the description, please check the enclosed “inspiration” guide to help you write it. The guide is only for your use and does not need to be returned. These will be turned in Monday, July 29th as you are judged for modeling.

AFTER the fashion revue is over, we ask that all projects be taken out to the fairgrounds (go to the north door of the 4-H exhibit building) and the committee will set up the display for the fair. Grand and Reserve Grand champion ribbons will be presented at the public revue but will then be collected and used for display at the fair. If you are modeling a two-piece outfit, please provide a separate hanger for each article of clothing (pants or skirts will need clip hangers). This will make your outfit easier to display.
